ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE HEARING**

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An ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE (“OSC”) hearing will be held by the Hawaii Community Development Authority (“Authority” or “HCDA”), State of Hawaii, pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules §15-219-28(1), on February 19, 2014, at 9:00 a.m., at HCDA’s office located at 461 Cooke Street, Honolulu, Hawaii 96813, to allow the Association of Apartment Owners of One Waterfront Towers and Kakaako United (“Petitioners”) to show cause why the Authority is permitted to grant the Petitioners the relief they seek under each of the statutes and rules cited in the Amended Petition, filed on October 25, 2013.

Petitioners submitted a petition for relief from the Authority’s August 7, 2013 approval of the Planned Development Permit KAK 13-033 (“Permit”), issued to The Collection, LLC (“Developer”) for a project located at 604 Ala Moana Boulevard, Tax Map Key Nos. (1) 2-1-055: 004, 009, and 017, under Kamehameha Schools’ (“Land Owner”) Kaiāulu ‘O Kaka‘ako Master Plan Permit No. PL MASP 13.2.8.

Pursuant to an OSC issued by the Authority, dated February 5, 2014, the Developer and Land Owner were deemed necessary parties for purposes of this proceeding. Accordingly, the Petitioners, Developer, and Land Owner are the only parties to this proceeding.

Each party will be allowed 30 minutes to present their position on the OSC. After each party has presented their position at the hearing, they will be afforded a brief opportunity to reply to the positions presented by the other parties. The Presiding Officer may limit the time for a reply to 5 minutes in order to ensure an orderly and just proceeding.

Any party may either retain counsel or appear on his/her own behalf or send an authorized representative if the party is a partnership, corporation, trust, or association.

Pursuant to Sections 92-4 and 92-5(a)(4), Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Authority may elect to convene in executive session. For questions or concerns, please call the office of the HCDA at 594-0300.
