KEY CONCERNS

- The project must be the right fit for the harbor
- The project should honor Kewalo as a "working harbor"
- Upgraded parking and restroom facilities must be included
- Access to Kewalo Point should not be compromised
- The project area should not stretch makai of the existing restrooms between Ala Moana Beach and Kewalo Point
- The scale of the project initially felt too big for some stakeholders
- The parking structure appeared to dominate the project site
- Losing parking spaces during construction
- Loss of green space makai of the current parking lot
- Disruption of business during the construction period



WHAT THEY LIKED

- The farm-to-table theme of the project's food experiences
- The mix of food and entertainment venues
- Better and cleaner bathroom facilities than currently present on site
- Improved security in the general area
- Focus on attracting a local audience
- Moderate price points
- Potential for increasing foot traffic in the area
- A unique live music venue

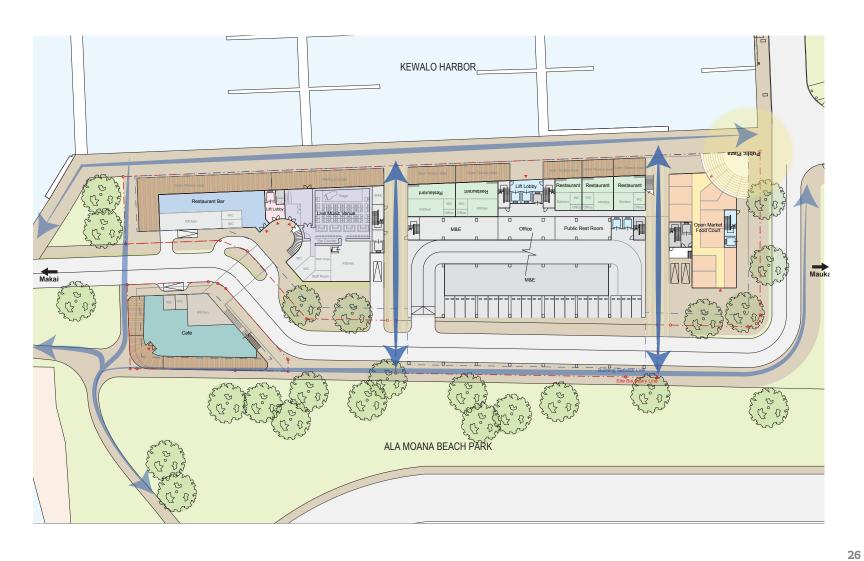

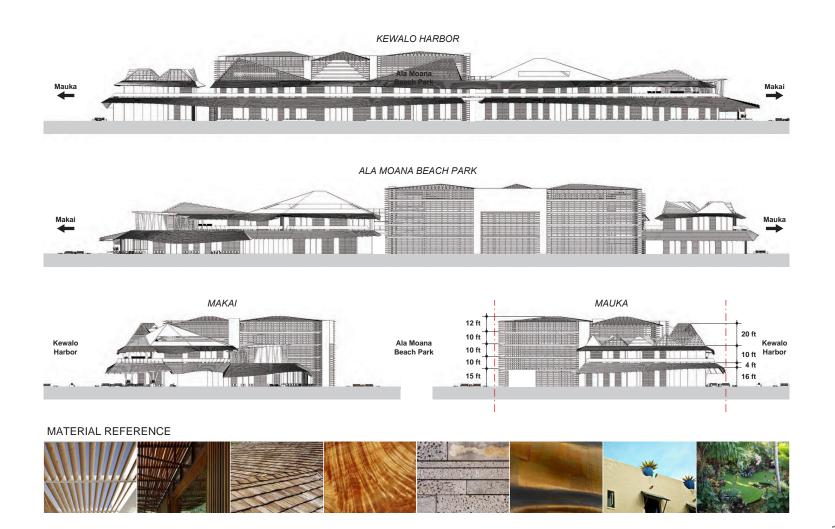
