Following the base closure, the Navy's old bachelor officer quarters fell into a neglected state after being vacant for more than a decade.















- For example VA parking requirement: 528 spaces, 2x more than required by HCDA rules






DEVELOPMENT TIME TABLE










PLANNING COMPONENTS



Exhibit 1 **Location & TMK Map**



GREEN BUILDING CERTIFICATION





Requirements

The VA requires the VA Clinic be certified and rated under the Green Globes Building Certification system, a green building rating system that is comparable to and an alternative to the LEED system.

The VA requires that the VA Clinic achieve 55-69% of total applicable Green Globes points to reach certification.

KCDD Rules specify that a project shall achieve sustainability points in stormwater design, heat island effect, and water efficient landscaping

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






PROJECT: KALAELOA PARCEL 1




