<p>My name is Dwight Victor and I'm the President of the Kalaeloa Heritage and Legacy Foundation (KHLF). We are a non-profit 501(3)(c) community organization dedicated to preserving and protecting the cultural, historical, and archaeological landscape of Kalaeloa through the management and operation of the Kalaeloa Heritage Park. In 2010 the Hawaii Community Development Agency requested that the Hawaiian Civic Club of Kapolei establish a dedicated entity to manage and operate the Kalaeloa Heritage Park and assist HCDA in the performance of its required duties with respect to maintaining the cultural resources located at the Park and outlined in its Deed to the property. Since 2011 the KHLF has faithfully dedicated itself to providing management and operation of the Park. The current Right of Entry granted to the KHLF so that it can continue these efforts is scheduled to expire on 17 November 2021. Without an extension to the current ROE the KHLF will be unable to continue these efforts nor will it be able to continue to work toward the shared goal of a long term Stewardship Agreement between the KHLF and HCDA. On behalf of the KHLF Board of Directors I urge the HCDA Board to grant the required authorization to the HCDA Executive Director and allow him to extend the current ROE for an additional 12 month period. <p>Kalaeloa Heritage Park has done amazing things for not only the significant and extensive Hawaiian cultural resources but also for the natural resources. Two federally and state listed endangered plant species (Euphorbia skottsbergii, Achyranthes splendens variety rotundifolia) occur naturally in the wild habitat within the parcel and are endemic to the ewa plains. As the Oahu Botanist for DLNR DOFAW I can testify that this site is a significant population in both numbers of individuals and location of both species. These are protected species and cannot be demolished or taken without consultation with the state and without mitigation efforts and funding for many years. The volunteer hours of work that have gone into this site are enormous and have certainly benefited the resources. These resources are not replaceable!! All prior mitigation efforts for these species have been unsuccessful. Please continue to allow the Kalaeloa Heritage Park and their volunteers to have access to this parcel and provide protection and preservation of these irreplaceable resources.
