# Comment

I support Oliver McMillan's request to amend the Development Permit No. KAK 12-075 by waiving or permanently suspending the requirement of HAR §15-217-55(k)(2) for the Symphony Honolulu project and that such waiver or permanent suspension be retroactive from April 5, 2015.

HAR §15-217-55(k)(2) states that "visible light transmission level shall be fifty per cent or greater". However, these visible light transmission (VLT) values are too high to also comply with energy efficiency standards and meet a separate HCDA standard for LEED compliance. It has been shown that no commercially available tower glass can meet both VLT and LEED standards.

As a future resident of the Symphony Honolulu, I am excited by the possibility of the project finishing on time. The windows at this point have already been installed up to above the 30th floor, and a requirement to change the windows would be burdensome to the project, the community, and resources that could otherwise be used on future projects. Further, other buildings in the Kaka'ako neighborhood have windows that are well below the VLT limit and have been grandfathered into older rules that didn't specify window VLT. I support the Development Permit being amended to waive this requirement, and I also hope that HCDA will re-assess the VLT restrictions, given their conflict with a separate LEED compliance restriction.
