# *Kalaeloa Report*November 7, 2018

#### **Planning and Development Activities**

- Construction of the Enterprise Energy Corridor is on schedule and the microtunneling activities continued during October 2018. Upon completion, the conduit would be available for new electrical and telecommunication services along the corridor and subject to a connection fee from the respective utility company for new service.
- On October 9, 2018, the Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA) staff
  met with their consultant Austin Tsutsumi & Associates Inc. (ATA). ATA is
  conducting the meets and bounds survey for the district and has finished their survey
  for the majority of the Kalaeloa roadways. They are working to gain landowner
  permission to access the remaining remote areas.
- The Kalaeloa Public Safety (KPS) team held its bimonthly meeting on October 18, 2018. The attendees discussed illegal trespassing, homeless encampments and unauthorized dumping issues in the district. The representatives also sought to clarify joint enforcement jurisdiction by federal, state and county agencies.
- Staff met with representatives from Arion Energy (Arion) on October 19, 2018. The renewable energy company is planning to build a 2.2. megawatt photovoltaic project on Department of Hawaiian Home Lands property in Kalaeloa. The project is unique because it will be a community-based renewable energy project which allows persons to sign a subscription with the electrical provider in return for a discount on power purchases. Arion anticipates that they will request a HCDA development permit application in the next quarter.
- On October 23, 2018, HCDA staff conducted a site tour for the Hawaii Film Office (HFO) and Department of Accounting and General Services staff. The HFO was interested in viewing potential sites in Kalaeloa for the future development of a film studio in west Oahu. Kalaeloa is being considered as an alternative to the University of Hawaii West Oahu campus.

### Landowner/user Assessments and Revenue

• As approved by the Authority at its June 6, 2018 meeting and pursuant to HRS §§ 206E-195 and 206E-196, staff issued Kalaeloa Assessment notices to non-federal land users for Fiscal Year 2018-2019 on June 29, 2018. During the month of October 2018, staff confirmed receipt of the assessment from the State of Hawaii Homeless Programs Office and mailed out "past due" notices to landowners/users that did not remit an assessment payment as of October 1, 2018.
