## Leilani Pulmano, Chair (Maui)

Leilani Pulmano, holds a degree from the University of Hawaii's School of Travel Industry Management. This guided Leilani to a career in tourism with Hyatt Hotels and Resorts where she worked in several different cities before returning to Hawaii to work for Maui Land & Pineapple Company in Community Development. She is currently a Project Manager at Munekiyo & Hiraga.

Leilani is active in the community with Lahaina Bypass Now, an organization working towards transportation solutions, and Ka Ipu Kukui, an organization of upcoming leaders dedicated to improving Maui Nui.

She currently volunteers as a member of the Catholic Charities Housing Development Corporation and Hawaii State Department of Human Services Financial Assistance Advisory Council, and is a former member of the Hawaii Parkinson Association. Fukumoto also volunteers for Project Dana, providing respite care through home visits to elderly individuals. She earned a bachelor's degree in English and a master's degree in public administration from UH Manoa.

## Melvin Kahele, Director, (At-Large)

Melvin Kahele, Jr.'s brings his experience as President/Principal Executive Officer for the Teamsters Union, Local 996 and Legislative lobbyist for the Ironworkers Union, Local 625 Stabilization Fund to the HHFDC board.
